### **CELL PHONES**



- Cell phone makers and service providers to make phones hearing aid compatible (HAC) for people using hearing aids and cochlear implants.
- Devices that are HAC compliant have:
  - Less interference (e.g., buzzing, whining, static)
  - Robust speakers for adequate loudness
  - Better telecoil connections
- HAC compliant device packages are marked with "M" or "T" ratings
- Check the packaging/description card in the store
- $\bullet\,$  Search online if you know the make and model of the phone

## WHAT ARE "M" AND "T" RATINGS?

#### <u>"M" RATING</u>


- "M" rating refers to the microphone mode.
- Wireless devices rated M3 or M4 are likely to generate less interference.
- M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

#### **"T" RATING**


- "T" rating refers to the telecoil mode.
- Wireless devices rated T3 or T4 are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch")
- T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

Look for M4/T4 to have the best chance of being interference free whether used with your hearing aids or cochlear implants in microphone or t-coil mode.


